Further information about Individual Learning Accounts (ILA), Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) and Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is listed below:

ILA Scotland

An Individual Learning Account (ILA) is funded by the Scottish Government and can help you pay towards the costs of learning. To apply you must be 16 or over and living in Scotland; earning less than £22,000 or be on benefits. You are not eligible to apply if you are still at school.

You can get up to £200 towards the cost of your course fees. You must ensure that your account is in place before you start the course (allow 2- 4 weeks to process) and that the course you want to do is registered with ILA Scotland.

Student Awards Agency for Scotland – SAAS

Funding for Higher Education

SAAS is an agency of the Scottish Government that provides financial support to eligible students who are undertaking a course of **Higher Education** in the UK. It is the organisation to contact when you need to apply for financial support while you study. Part-time Study

If you are going to study part-time you may not be eligible for a student loan and bursary, but you may be entitled to apply for up to £500 towards the cost of your course.

Disabled Students Allowance – DSA

If you have a disability or learning difficulty, you may also claim for certain extra expenses which arise because you are on a course of study, such as items that will aid your learning or software that could help you to study. In some cases DSA could also help to cover personal support such as sign language interpreters and note takers. Education Maintenance Allowance - EMA

An Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is an allowance of £30 per week payable to eligible young adults who stay on in full-time education at school, College or if they start an [Activity Agreement](#) after their 16th birthday. It can be paid for a maximum of 3 consecutive years, with usually 2 years at most in secondary school.

The young person has to satisfy attendance requirements and also complete an EMA application form. A contract has to be signed between the young person and their School or Learning Centre before payments can be issued.

It is the responsibility of the young adult applying to approach their school/supervisor in regard to completing their Learning Agreement/Activity Agreement.

Note – no payments will be issued until a Learning Agreement/Activity Agreement has been completed.

A new application for young people attending Highland Council schools / Learning Centres must be submitted each year using the correct application form. These forms are available from:
